

Extra Recyclables

If you have any extra recycling, please save it until your next pickup day, as we are only able to take those items that fit inside your recycle toter.

Did You

One recycled aluminum can saves enough energy to power a TV or computer for 3 hours or a 100-watt bulb for 20 hours

Recycling one glass bottle saves enough energy to light a 100-watt bulb for 4 hours

Recycling one # of steel conserves enough energy to light a 60-watt bulb for 26 hours (approx. 7 cat food cans or 4 dog food cans)

Recycling a one gallon plastic milk jug will save enough energy to keep a 100-watt bulb burning for 11 hours

Recycling a foot high stack of news paper saves enough energy to heat a home for 17 hours

A 6-pack of aluminum cans saves enough energy to drive a car 5 miles





Residential Curbside Recycling

The City of Enumclaw is now offering All-in-One Blue Cart Recycling that is designed to be easier and more convenient for our residential customers.

Rather than sorting recyclables into three separate bins, we now provide a lightweight, weatherproof, wheeled cart that will hold all of your recyclables and can actually reduce your volume of garbage.

The new program will now accept items that were previously excluded from our recycling program.

Please take a couple of minutes to read this brochure thoroughly. You will find tips about the preparation of your recyclables, changes in materials accepted at curbside, answer recycling questions and information on other recycling alternatives.



Container Placement

Please place your recycling, garbage and yardwaste containers at the curb/street/alley by 6:00 AM on your scheduled pickup day...

...at least three (3) feet from cars, trees, mailboxes and fences

...as close to the curb as possible

...cart lids opening toward the street

...two (2) feet apart from other receptacles



Did you know that 31% of Enumclaw's waste is recycled?

REMOVE CONTAINERS FROM THE STREET AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER COLLECTION



Plastic Recycling

Plastic bottles, jugs and dairy tubs ONLY are accepted for recycling. If it isn't a bottle, jug or dairy tub, and it cannot be reused, it goes into your trash receptacle.

Plastics NOT accepted:

- *Plastic bags
- *Styrofoam packing peanuts and bubble wrap
- *plastic take-out containers
- *plastic bakery and meat trays
- *plastic plates, cups or utensils
- *prescription vials

Computers & TVs

Computers, laptops, monitors, separated computer circuit boards and televisions contain heavy metals. Other electronics, including computer peripherals, cell phones, photocopiers, fax machines, stereos, VCRs and DVD players CANNOT be disposed of as garbage and must be recycled, although curbside recycling is NOT offered at this time. To dispose of any electronics, please contact King County's Take-It-Back Network by calling 206-296-4466.



Yes, to these items...

- *clean paper and mail
- *flattened cardboard
- *newspapers and magazines
- *paperback books (*including phone books*)
- *milk cartons
- *juice boxes
- *plastic bottles, jars and jugs
- *plastic dairy tubs
- *frozen food boxes
- *aluminum cans
- *steel or tin cans
- *all colors of glass jars, bottles and jugs with lids and caps removed

No, to these item...

- *food soiled paper or boxes
- *plastic bags
- *plastic take-out containers
- *plastic bakery or meat trays
- *plastic plates, cups, utensils
- *Styrofoam containers or peanuts
- *prescription vials
- *paper towels
- *aluminum foil or foil baking pans
- *lids or caps of any kind
- *Needles or syringes
- *toxic containers (oil, etc)
- *disposable diapers or rags
- *ceramics or dishes
- *light bulbs
- *mirrors or window glass
