### Public Safety Committee Members & Related Staff

The meeting began at 6:01pm and ended at 6:47pm. Council members Ed Storton, Jan Martinell, and Sabrina Waterhouse were present, also present were Chief Tim Floyd, Commander Tony Ryan, and Records Manager Sarah Taylor.

- I. Opening Remarks-PSC meeting expectations
- II. E-bikes ordinance discussion
  - a. Chief Floyd presented Electric Motorcycle Ordinance 1844 from North Bend as proposed ordinance language for Enumclaw to adopt
  - b. Chief Floyd proposed moving forward with Electric Motorcycle Ordinance for Enumclaw as well as updating existing helmet ordinance for bicycles
  - c. Committee members agreed to move forward with proposed ordinance and verbiage updates
- III. Corrections facility MAT/MOUD update
  - a. Commander Ryan provided comments for re-entry program requirements for inmates struggling with opiate addiction
  - b. Enumclaw City Jail has approximately a 28% recovery program success rate for inmates, versus the average 3-5% success rate nationwide
  - c. Rise and Root is the new company that will be providing recovery services to the Enumclaw Jail moving forward to replace Advanced Mental Health of Washington
- IV. Roundtable discussion
  - a. Council member Storton expressed gratitude and appreciation for Enumclaw Police Department's response to the high school protest at City Hall that ended in 2 juvenile arrests
  - b. Council member Martinell expressed frustration at the hands-off approach by the Enumclaw School District and the failure to dissuade students from leaving campus
  - c. Chief Floyd explained the public reaction received about the protest, with most civilians being supportive, while a few were angry
  - d. Council member Waterhouse brought up the potential need for cameras or extra signage at the 4-way stop sign at Cole Street and Stevenson Ave
  - e. Chief Floyd explained that there has not been very many accidents at the intersection over the span of several years, but that the Public Works Director has been looking into that possibility
