Monday, March 22, 2021

THE MEETING BEGAN AT 5:01 PM AND ENDED AT 5:41 PM. COUNCILMEMBERS JOHNSON AND CHEVASSUS WAS PRESENT AS WELL AS STAFF MEMBER CHRIS PASINETTI.

I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Meeting summary from March 8, 2021.
- B. Port of Seattle Grant. Pasinetti updated the committee on the status of the Port of Seattle Grant. The application will be turned in at the end of March or first part of April. The grant will be used for advertising events at the Expo center to attract regional and local tourism to the Enumclaw Plateau.
- C. Addressing Policy for newly annexed areas. Pasinetti gave a brief overview of past policy on addressing for newly annexed areas as well as the problems with that past policy. With the inclusion of new Computer Aided Dispatch systems and the need for consistent addressing system is necessary. Councilmember Johnson indicated support for address changes as it will likely increase public safety. Pasinetti indicated this would be included as part of information provided to the newly annexed area for the Sierra Vista/Grace Point Church.

II. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Revised Legal Description for Annexation of the Mountain Rainier Christian Center (MRCC). Pasinetti indicated that King County contacted us regarding the legal description for the annexation of the MRCC. They stated that the legal did not include the portion of the annexation that included the portion of SR 410. Pasinetti indicated that staff would get a corrected legal description and bring an Ordinance for the City Council in April.
- B. License enforcement for food trucks. Pasinetti gave the committee and update on code enforcement regarding licensing for food trucks. There are a number of food trucks in town operating without their business, special (or both as required) licenses. Code enforcement has sent letters reminding the operators and the restaurants where they are operating of the requirements.
