MINUTES

COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE (CSC)

CITY OF ENUMCLAW – **MICROSOFT TEAMS**

- I. CALL TO ORDER: Councilmember Wright called the meeting to order at 5pm.
- II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM 4/19/2021: Motion to approved by Wright, second by Sauvageau, motion passed.
- III. COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS
 - a. Acquisition of 244th property: Contract has been signed and returned by the property owner, Resolution will come forward to full Council on June 14th. The committee was in favor of acquisition per the Park Plan.
 - b. Enumclaw Landscape Maintenance Contract Extension: Larson presented the added scope of Garrett Park mowing and treatment after the irrigation addition, addition of maintenance of Scott Park, Triangle Park, and Pool planter beds, noting an additional \$16,000-\$18,000 per year respectively, for 2022 and 2023. The existing contract allowed for a 2 year extension. The committee was in favor.
 - c. Ordinance No. 2710: Amend duties of Library Advisory Board: Larson explained that this was a house keeping item to remove the advisory capacity of the Board for the Schlotfeldt fund since that fund is for historical preservation funding and the library no longer maintains historical records. The committee was in favor.
- IV. DISCUSSION ITEMS
 - a. First Responder Monument: The Mayor share the concept for the monument to include 3 glass benches that would light up at night representing Police, Fire, and Medical responders, seeking donations and possible additional funding through REET to complete the project. The committee felt this was a great project to move forward with.
 - b. Rotary Park Gazebo: Discussion was held regarding direction of possible demolition of the gazebo due to homeless people congregating. Wright suggested pausing since the issue has since been mitigated and doesn't feel we should move forward

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with spending the funds to do something that is no longer a problem. The committee agreed we should revisit.

- c. Helmet Ordinance: Larson shared that the Public Safety Committee would be reviewing the existing Ordinance for bicycle helmets and decide if skateboards, roller blades, etc. should be added. The committee feels that ultimately it should come down to the PD and Public Safety to make the first recommendation since a big concern is enforcement. Possible awareness campaign and helmet giveaway event was discussed.
- d. Dog Park: Aggressive dogs: There has been an increase in aggressive dogs at the dog park. It was suggested to post clearer signage at the park stating "if you see something, say something", listed with the PD phone number. King County Animal Control can then be contacted to take the necessary action. It was also discussed to educate on how to identify aggressive dog behavior and what to do via social media and flyers.

- V. ADJOURNMENT: Motion to adjourn by Sauvageau, second by Wright, motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 5:57pm.
