YES!

Yard Waste

- ♻️ Grass and leaves
- ♻️ Weeds
- ♻️ Plant Trimmings
- ♻️ Houseplants
- ♻️ Branches
(under 4' long, 4" diam.)

Food Scraps

- ♻️ Meat, fish, poultry, bones
- ♻️ Dairy products (yogurt, cottage cheese, etc.)
- ♻️ Fruit and vegetable scraps
- ♻️ Bread, pasta and grains
- ♻️ Eggshells, nutshells
- ♻️ Coffee grounds and filters
- ♻️ Leftovers
- ♻️ Tea leaves and bags

Food-Soiled Paper

- ♻️ Greasy pizza delivery boxes
- ♻️ Coffee filters with coffee grounds
- ♻️ Paper towels and napkins
- ♻️ Uncoated paper plates and cups
- ♻️ Uncoated paper food wrap
- ♻️ Uncoated paper food bags
- ♻️ Paper grocery bags containing food scraps
- ♻️ Paper egg cartons
- ♻️ Paper berry cartons

Uncoated food soiled paper does not have a shiny surface.

When in doubt throw it out.

Contamination increases the cost of recycling.



NO!

- ⊘ Absolutely no plastic
 - No plastic-coated cartons (milk, ice cream, etc)
 - No plastic-coated paper or cups
 - No plastic bags
 - No plastic food wrap
 - No plastic food containers
 - No Styrofoam food containers
 - No plastic-coated food take-out containers
- ⊘ Grease or liquids
- ⊘ Pet waste
- ⊘ Diapers
- ⊘ Soil, rocks
- ⊘ Stumps
- ⊘ Branches over 4'x 4"
- ⊘ Lumber or fencing
- ⊘ Metal, glass
- ⊘ Hazardous waste
